The Scottish Rite is waiving the initiation fee for all Master Masons (not only those who go through the one-day class). Dues of \$98.00 for 2017 will be required. DID YOU KNOW?

Ely S. Parker, a full-blooded Native American chief, was the grandson of Red Jacket, a close friend of George Washington.

He was a Union Brigadier General in the Civil War, and served as General Grant's secretary.

He was raised in Batavia Lodge No. 88, Batavia, New York, and later affiliated with Valley Lodge No. 109.

He demitted and became a founder and first Worshipful Master of Akron Lodge No. 527 of New York. Ely Parker Lodge No. 1002 of Buffalo, New York is named after him.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

September 15, 1857

In 1857 at Cincinnati, OH. was born Bro. William Howard Taft, 27th US President. His term of office was March 4, 1909-March 3, 1913. Following his Presidency he became a law professor at Yale University until his appointment as Chief Justice of the US Supreme Court in 1921. He was made a Mason "at sight" on June 18, 1909, by Grand Master Charles S. Hoskinson, then became affiliated with Kilwinning Lodge No. 356 at Cincinnati, OH. He later was made Honorary Member of Crescent Lodge No 28 at Cedar Rapids, IO. He died at Washington, DC March 8, 1930 and is buried at Arlington Cemetery.

September 22, 1989

Bro. Irving Berlin, Songwriter, died at Age 101. Bro. Berlin's best-selling songs ranged from "Alexander's Rag-Time Band" in 1911, to "White Christmas" in 1942. He was equally well-known for his theater and film music which included "Top Hat," "Follow The Fleet," and "Annie Get Your Gun." The entire royalties for several of his songs he gave to a charity for deprived youth. He was made a Mason in Munn Lodge 190 in New York City, and was active both in the Scottish rite and as a Shrine Mason. He died in New York City.

September 29, 1907

In 1907 Freemasons lay the cornerstone for the Washington National Cathedral in Washington D.C.

THE LODGE ALMONER'S FUND

Every Lodge is directed to have an Almoner's Fund in place dedicated to the relief of worthy distressed members and their families, and will appoint an Almoner to manage the fund. The fund is created by assessing \$5 for every active member of the Lodge annually.

At least 50 percent of the fund will be paid yearly to qualified applicants of your Lodge who have experienced a hardship. Any member, widow or dependent child may apply to the Lodge for assistance through a member or the District Deputy Grand Master. If an applicant so requests, his or her application will be considered by the Lodge in confidence; the identity of the applicant will only be made known to the Lodge Almoner and the Worshipful Master. The Lodge Treasurer, Secretary and District Deputy Grand Master may be included on an as-needed basis. It is important to note that all the funds stay in the Lodge for assistance requests from that Lodge.

The Almoner's Funds will only be used as approved by Lodge vote; in emergency cases, the Lodge Almoner may seek approval from the District Deputy Grand Master before Lodge approval, but such circumstances will be disclosed to the membership. The Almoner will ascertain the need of applicants for assistance. He will then decide to either make a recommendation for a monetary grant or refer the applicant to other appropriate committees of the Lodge and/or to other possible resources available through the Grand Lodge (such as the Masonic Outreach Program.
