THE CHARGE IS DELIVERED

The Charge given in the First Degree cannot be said to be laden with symbolism because it is not intended to be. It is an explanation of the principles by which a Mason should live and an exhortation to the candidate to do so. If properly done, this address will remain with a brother for the rest of his life. I often think that there is more emphasis on the brother delivering the Charge than on the candidate, because it is seen as 'if you can do this, you can do anything' ritual test-piece. We do really need to appreciate that it is not the fact that Fred Bloggs got to the end of the Charge with only one or two prompts that counts! It is the fact that Fred understood it, the way in which he delivered it, and the impression it made on the candidate.

One interesting aspect of the Charge is that it exhorts us to adhere to 'the ancient landmarks of the Order'. It is difficult to adhere to anything, when you're not sure what it is. The landmarks are basically those tenets of Masonry without which whatever was going on would not be Masonry. Examples are the need for a belief in a Supreme Being, and having the Volume of the Sacred Law open at meetings. I am not going to attempt a list because Grand Lodge never has and any foreign Grand Lodge that has done so has met with criticism from all quarters for including things which have not been applied since Time Immemorial, which, of course, in Masonic terms is the year of the establishment of the Premier Grand Lodge of England in 1717.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

April 1, 1889

Bro. Wallace Beery was born in Kansas City, MO. He was voted "The world's Best Actor" in 1934 by the International Motion Picture Exposition at Venice, Italy. Bro. Beery ran away from home as a child to become an elephant trainer in a circus. His first job in films was as a female impersonator. He became noted for his character roles. Bro. Beery belonged to Blaney Lodge 271 of Chicago, IL, held a 32 deg. AASR, and belonged to the Shrine. He died April 25, 1949.

April 14, 1902

Bro. James C. Penney opened his first store, in Kemmerer, Wyo. The store was to be the first of what was to become at the time the world's largest department store chain with more than 1700 stores. Bro. Penney was born on September 16, 1875 in Hamilton, MO. After the 1929 stock market crash Bro. Penney lost his fortune and wound up beaten and despondent at age 56 and living in a sanitarium. But he proved his method was sound by borrowing money and staging a comeback, which saw him recouping his fortune. He received his degrees at Wasatch Lodge No. 1, Salt Lake City, UT, April 28, May 19, and June 2, 1911. In 1955 he became a dual member of United Services Lodge No. 1118, New York City.

WHAT IS AN OBLONG SQUARE?

A rectangle with its length greater than its breadth, or, as applied to the shape of a Lodge Room, the east-west dimension being greater. In ancient times, the world was supposed to be shaped like an oblong square, surrounding the Mediterranean Sea. Symbolically, this is the form of the Lodge Room.
