THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

February 15, 1933

At Bay Front Park, Miami, Florida, Bro. Franklin Delano Roosevelt, then President of the US, escaped an assassin's bullet meant for him but which, instead, hit and killed Anton J. Cermak, then Mayor of Chicago. Joseph Zangara, the 32-year-old assassin, was electrocuted on March 20, 1933 at the Raiford, Florida State Prison.

February 20, 1792

Bro. and President George Washington signed the Postal Service Act, establishing a permanent Postal Service with a detailed set of rules and procedures. A temporary Service had been in existence since 1775. Bro. Benjamin Franklin was named the first Postmaster. On July 26, 1775, members of the Second Continental Congress, meeting in Philadelphia, agreed ". . . that a Postmaster General be appointed for the United States, who shall hold his office at Philadelphia, and shall be allowed a salary of 1,000 dollars per annum . . ." That simple statement signaled the birth of the Post Office Department, the predecessor of the United States Postal Service and the second oldest department or agency of the present United States of America.

DID YOU KNOW?

'Scots Mason' or 'Scots Master' Lodges

The mysterious degree known as the 'Scots Master' is mentioned in the minutes of some lodges in the 1730's and thereabouts; for example, in the minutes of an old Bath lodge we learn that "the Lodge of Masters met Extraordinary & our following worthy Borthrs were made & admitted Scots Masr Masons". This minute is typical of a number. It is fairly well agreed that the word 'Scots' is no real indication that the degree was of Scottish origin, but there is a strong feeling that it might have been the creation of French masons, possibly influenced by Scots, large numbers of whom had fled from Scotland in the Jacobite troubles to take refuge in France. It is likely that the Scots Degree was a preliminary to either the Royal Arch or the Mark Degree-just possibly to both. The Scots Degree remains a mystery, and anything that can be said on the subject is nothing more than conjecture. Some students believe it to be connected with an alleged Jacobite movement.

Editor's Note: The Jacobite movement in Great Britain and Ireland aimed to restore the Roman Catholic Stuart King James II of England and Ireland and his heirs to the thrones of England, Scotland, France and Ireland.
