# THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

## April 16, 1789

President-elect and Bro. George Washington left Mount Vernon, Va., for his inauguration in New York. He had just been unanimously selected by the members of the Electoral College to become the first President of the United States of America. Although the new President-Elect had huge landholdings in Virginia, he was reported to be "cash poor." Rumors had it he was forced to borrow money to pay his expenses for the trip to the inauguration in New York.

#### April 19, 1951

Gen. and Bro. Douglas MacArthur, relieved of his Far East command by President and Bro. Harry S Truman, bid farewell to Congress, quoting a line from a ballad "popular" in the British trenches in the First World War. "Old soldiers never die; they just fade away." Bro. MacArthur was made a Mason "at sight" by Bro. Samuel Hawthorne, Grand Master of the Philippines, on January 17, 1936. He affiliated with Manila Lodge No. 1, Manila. He received the 32nd degree, Scottish Rite at Manila the same year. And he became a life member of the Nile Shrine Temple, Seattle, WA. He died in 1964.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

#### A MASONIC MOON LODGE?

On a recent trip to Washington D.C. a stop was made at the Scottish Rite SMJ House of the Temple, a 180 year old building designed to resemble the Tomb of Mausolus in Halicarnassus. The building was more recently popularized in Dan Brown's *The Lost Symbol*. In its museum and library there are areas devoted to Scottish poet Robert Burns, Confederate mysticist and Freemason Albert Pike and artifacts of Freemasonry and famous Freemasons from American history. One such artifact of note was a Scottish Rite flag that astronaut Buzz Aldrin took to the moon as one of his two carry-on items during the Apollo 11 flight in 1969. According to the tour guide, this constituted the formation of the Masonic Moon Lodge.

Research of the flag revealed that prior to the Apollo 11 Mission, Brother Aldrin had been given a "special dispensation" from the Texas Grand Master to claim Masonic Jurisdiction Territory over the Moon. When they landed in the Sea of Tranquility, Bro. Aldrin certified that he exercised that authority and upon his return to Earth, a charter was issued by the Grand Lodge of Texas for the formation of Tranquility Lodge No. 2000. According to the Grand Lodge of Texas website, "Tranquility Lodge 2000 is based in Texas under the auspices of the Grand Lodge of Texas until such time as the Lodge may hold its meeting on the Moon"

The Masonic apron that he wore at the cornerstone laying ceremony for The Masonic Temple in Philadelphia is currently on display in their museum Exhibit Hall. Another fraternal connection in Brother Godfrey's life (albeit non-Masonic): he was buried in Mount Peace Cemetery, owned and established by the Odd Fellows Cemetery Company of Philadelphia.

## SEVERAL MASONS DID WELL IN 'LIFE AFTER THE WHITE HOUSE'

"The Week", a national news magazine, in its January 27, 2017 issue, published a story on some highlights of past U.S. Presidents – after they left the White House.

A few examples of former White House residents commented on by "The Week: were Masons.

- The article noted that Andrew Johnson (a Tennessee Mason), "who was impeached and acquitted, rebounded to become the only ex-president to serve in the U.S. Senate, representing Tennessee."
- Theodore Roosevelt mounted a third-party campaign against the re-election of his own former vice-president and chosen successor, William Howard Taft. Both were Masons. Both lost in the three-party campaign as Woodrow Wilson was elected.
- Taft was "humiliated" as he lost that election, the magazine said, but wound up with his dream job an appointment to the U.S. Supreme Court as Chief Justice. The appointment came from President Warren G. Harding, also a Mason. According to the story, "Most historians agree that Taft belongs to a select group of post-presidencies out-shown their tenure in the White House."
