THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

September 20, 1870

Italian troops under the leadership of Bro. Giuseppe Garibaldi took control of the Papal States, leading to the unification of Italy. He is lauded as an Italian patriot and hero of the Risorgimento, the movement for the liberation and union of Italy. In 1833 he joined Mazzini's revolutionary society, "Young Italy," and, after early reverses, took up the struggle for Italian freedom in 1848, bringing it to completion in 1870 when Italian troops freed Rome from Papal control He was initiated in Lodge L'Ami de la Avertu, at Montevideo, in 1844. At one time he was a member of the French Grand Orient and became Grand Master of the Grand Orient of Palerma, 33." Freemasons were at the forefront of political change throughout Europe. Bro. Garibaldi himself made an explicit link between the Craft and his political vision. "Whenever there is a human cause, we are certain to find Freemasonry, for it is the fundamental basis of all true liberal associations. Forever I will pride myself on my Masonic connection." Bro. Garibaldi's 1860 autobiography was edited by Alexander Dumas who subsequently was made a Mason at Naples in 1862. Bro. George Routledge, who published the English translation of Bro. Garibaldi's book, was also a member of the Craft.

NATIONAL ANTHEM – 210 YEARS OLD – CHANGING OUR 'FLAG' TO THE 'SYMBOL OF LIBERTY'

This month marks the 210th anniversary of the writing of the words of the Star Spangled Banner. It was penned as a poem by Francis Scott Key on September 13, 1814, as he watched the British bombard Fort McHenry at Baltimore. It was later put to music, but did not officially become the U.S. National Anthem for 117 years, until March 3, 1931, when Congress passed a resolution.

However, the creation of this tribute to the American Flag significantly changed the way citizens viewed the nation's flag.

According to USA Today (July 2, 2014), "Before the night of September 13, 1814, the flag was mostly thought of as a utilitarian marker, raised at military installations and used to identify government buildings. But after the successful battle of Fort McHenry and the words written by Key, the American flag, "became the symbol of liberty and perseverance, the life of the nation," according to Jeffrey Brodie, deputy director of the Smithsonian Institution's Lemelson Center, quoted in the USA Today article.

The words of the song, at a perilous moment in U.S. history, "helped stir Americans' imagination about their future," the newspaper said.

Brodie, the project manager and one of the curators for the Smithsonian's Star Spangled Banner preservation project, said that "Key's poem and the song that emerged were the first important works to infuse the flag with qualities of resilience and liberty," USA Today wrote.

DID YOU KNOW? The Longest Serving Grand Master in History

There have been only ten Grand Masters of the United Grand Lodge of England since the unification in 1813; of these, five were members of the Royal family. The current Grand Master Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, was elected and installed in 1967 and has service the longest, 57 years. His father, Prince George, Duke of Kent, had served as Grand Master from 1939 until he was killed in a military air crash in 1942. He was the fourth son of King George V. Prince Edward will turn 89 in October.

Prince George's great uncle, and uncle of King George V, was Prince Arthur, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, who served as Grand Master from 1901 until his death in 1939. Prince Arthur had previously been the longest serving Grand Master.

Prince Arthur's brother, King Edward VII, son of Queen Victoria, had served as Grand Master from 1874 to 1901 but was obligated to resign upon his ascension to the throne.

The first Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England was Prince Augustus Frederick, Duke of Sussex, son of King George III. He had previously served as the Grand Master of the Premier Grand Lodge of England (Moderns) while his brother, Prince Edward Augustus, Duke of Kent and Strathearn and father of Queen Victoria, was the Grand Master of the Ancient Grand Lodge of England.

GLOSSARY: MASONIC SKERRIT



In the English ritual, one of the working-tools of a Master Mason is an instrument usually made of wood, shaped like a letter T, and acts on a center pin, from which a line is drawn, chalked and struck, to mark out the ground for the intended edifice. In a speculative sense, it points out that straight and undeviating line of conduct laid down in the sacred volume.

It is related, symbolically, to the 24-inch gauge and the plumb rule, but has a specific connotation to the Third Degree. The main subject of the Third Degree is one's mortality and immortality. The skirret represents the foundation of the way of life we are to follow as laid down to us by our Creator keeping it on the straight and narrow, so to speak, using our Masonic principles.

We should allow the skirret, therefore, to remind us to start building our character on a proper foundation—namely, the many virtues of behaviour found in the Masonic ceremonies, and in the Holy Word of the Almighty. And we should allow this tool to remind us why we should do so—the end of our life shall end some day, and we should prepare now for what comes next.
