7 Habits of Highly Effective Lodges How many of the 7 habits does your lodge exhibit?

Great ritual and ceremonial - core is in the ritual, delivered and understood by the candidate that new members aspire to emulate and attract visitors to the lodge. No perfect ritual but well-rehearsed to stimulate the candidate, it's instruction not theatrical performance.

Efficient Administration – streamline process what is a necessary formality but deliver in a slick and timely manner.

- Active Support for New Members-more leisure options, doing more in the home, less likely to comply with Sr. lodge members if they don't know the reasons why. Symbols, teaching customs, planned and organized with mentors, what he wants not what the lodge thinks he needs.
- Involvement of all Members- Build relationships and attract new members. Every PM should have a role, not a collared office but using your skills. Committee makeup and regular meetings build connections. Family activities build support.
- Willingness to Evolve and Change- Allows us to stay fresh, attractive and relevant. Self-awareness and assessment of each lodge must be undertaken to stand out, otherwise they are just another lodge. Look for a niche that would make your lodge special. Daytime degree?
- Harmony-ritual teaches us to build and maintain harmony.

 Nothing destroys a lodge more than disharmony. Sr

 Members have a responsibility to maintain harmony.

 Decisions should not be made by a select few but everyone should have the power to do so. Leadership and Harmony of the lodge is up to the WM!
- Leadership from the Chair-Leadership is communication a way forward that others will follow vs management organization and discipline needs to get things done in a timely manner. Building a team approach gains trust and support so the WM can shine.
