#### **ESSAY PROGRAM**

Lodges are again participating in the Lodge Essay Program as laid out by the RWGM. Lodges will complete their essay according to the following criteria. This is a great and unique opportunity for lodges to research the history and share those stories with their brethren as a program at the September Stated Meeting.

TOPIC: Who are the 3 most influential members of your lodge? Lodges should choose 3 members to profile, placing them in the three following categories:

- MEMBER #1: Influential in the Community
- MEMBER #2: Influential in the Lodge
- MEMBER #3: Influential in Freemasonry in General.

Please describe in detail how these brothers were/are influential in his category. Note - the selected members may be living or deceased.

Requirements: Essay should be 1000 - 1500 words Times New Roman Font Double Spaced Essay must have Cover Page detailing the Lodge Name, Number, Address, and Author (s)

All Essays MUST be Submitted to your DDGM prior to June 1st. The DDGMs will gather and submit all their Lodges' essays to the Academy Secretary.

Lodges are encouraged to present the essay at the September Stated Meeting of their Lodges as the Program for that Month.
