THE SANCTUM SANCTORUM

The phrase Sanctum Sanctorum comes from the Latin Vulgate translation of the Hebrew Kodesh HaKodashim, meaning "the Holiest of Holies." It was the innermost chamber of Solomon's Temple, entered only once per year by the High Priest on Yom Kippur—veiled, solemn, and forbidden. Within it stood the Ark of the Covenant: a gold-covered chest containing the Tablets of the Law, Aaron's rod, and a pot of manna. The space was unadorned, windowless, and silent. A place not of display, but of Presence. Not to be seen—only to be approached.

Esoterically, the Sanctum Sanctorum is not merely a room—it is a state. A symbol of the perfected soul, where the Divine Presence may dwell. Its veils represent the layers of the self that must be lifted through purification, discipline, and illumination. In Freemasonry, the Sanctum Sanctorum corresponds to the Master Mason's degree. It is the symbolic location of the death and resurrection of the spiritual self. Here, the lost Word is sought—the true Light buried in darkness. It is the chamber of inner rebirth.

Every temple, every Lodge, and every individual has a Sanctum Sanctorum. It is the innermost chamber of conscience, the secret heart where truth may be encountered. One does not "build" it—it is uncovered through labor, moral courage, and spiritual ascent. Thus, the Sanctum Sanctorum endures not as a place upon earth, but as a cipher of the soul's highest aspiration: union with the Divine. To enter it is to pass beyond form and symbol, beyond doctrine and dogma—into the ineffable silence where the Word abides.

Therein is the mystery: the holiest place is not found but becomes.

Masonic Find 2025

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

September 20, 1870

Italian troops under the leadership of Bro. Giuseppe Garibaldi took control of the Papal States, leading to the unification of Italy. He is lauded as an Italian patriot and hero of the Risorgimento, the movement for the liberation and union of Italy. In 1833 he joined Mazzini's revolutionary society, "Young Italy," and, after early reverses, took up the struggle for Italian freedom in 1848, bringing it to completion in 1870 when Italian troops freed Rome from Papal control He was initiated in Lodge L'Ami de la Avertu, at Montevideo, in 1844. At one time he was a member of the French Grand Orient and became Grand Master of the Grand Orient of Palerma. 33." Freemasons were at the forefront of political change throughout Europe. Bro. Garibaldi himself made an explicit link between the Craft and his political vision. "Whenever there is a human cause, we are certain to find Freemasonry, for it is the fundamental basis of all true liberal associations. Forever I will pride myself on my Masonic connection." Bro. Garibaldi's 1860 autobiography was edited by Alexander Dumas who subsequently was made a Mason at Naples in 1862. Bro. George Routledge, who published the English translation of Bro. Garibaldi's book, was also a member of the Craft.
